

Scenario A

Sarah is 24 and a young care leaver. She has a number of criminal convictions for theft dating back 10 years. Her last offence was 2 years ago where she received a 6 months custodial sentence. Since her release Sarah has attended college and lives independently and is in the process of gaining custody of her 6 year old son.

Scenario B

John is 35, he lives with his partner and child in social housing. He was convicted of a hate-based crime when he was a member of a gang 17 years ago. John works part time in a warehouse. He is looking to volunteer to support young people and draw upon his lived experience of gang life to help young people make better choices.

Scenario C

Jodie is 27, she was convicted of threats to kill on her ex-partner 7 years ago. She was sentenced to 2 years probation order where she had to attend anger management courses and was fined £200 which she is still yet to pay. She is currently unemployed. She is currently undergoing treatment for alcohol use and lives in supported housing.

Scenario D

Simon is 18, he was convicted of burglary 4 years ago. He was sentenced to a 2 years' probation order and 80 hours unpaid work. He lives at home with his parents and is not in education, employment or training.
